## "It's That Time Again"

Dear Friends in Christ:

We are nearing the end of another fiscal year at Our Saviour's (July 2023-June 2024). Allow me to give you a quick snapshot of where we're at financially:

- Last spring, we passed a budget of \$541,292.
- We are currently running about \$2,000 behind our current expenses and \$10,000 behind where we need to be for the budget.
- Last fall, we encouraged gifts that would help us reach a little further, supporting our staff health insurance and our commitment to Justice in Action.
- If we are behind on the regular budget, we clearly aren't where we need to be to reach our additional goals.

As we prepare for the fiscal conversations coming up, we have some difficult decisions to

- 1. Can we support 100% of our staff healthcare?
- 2. Can we support increasing the hours and pay for Sam, our Worship, Music, & Arts Direc-
- 3. Can we fulfill our commitment to Justice in Action?
- 4. Can we envision the kind of energy and liveliness it takes to help these transitions happen?

We know that things like building maintenance and staff pay aren't particularly exciting topics. They don't necessarily inspire deep gifts and emotional responses. But these are the foundations of the work we do, walking with Christ and neighbor, healing brokenness together. They are the framework that allows us to reach out into our community and share the love of Christ with the world.

Our staff love working here—serving you, inspiring you, praying for you, caring for you. We rely on this building, as wonky as it is sometimes, to provide a safe space to gather, worship, learn, and be nourished. These are difficult financial times for our community and our world, but we trust God's provision and direction. Every week, I am so honored and excited to lead worship for this community. You truly are remarkable people. Thank you for all you do.


